It is estimated that 25% of all construction fatalities arise from traumatic brain injuries. Additionally, more than 50% of fatal work-related traumatic injuries were a result of falls – particularly from roofs, ladders, and scaffolds. Workers 65 and older are nearly four times more likely to sustain a fatal traumatic brain injury than workers 25 to 34 years old. Also, workers at organizations with fewer than 20 employees were more than 2.5 times more likely to die from a traumatic brain injury than those who worked for organizations with more than 100 employees.
